Vignette Assignment

Write your own vignettes that illustrate your life.

- You are required to write three vignettes on the same topic or on a variety of the following topics: your name, your neighborhood, a family member, a friend, a school experience, and/or an event.
- Each vignette should have its own creative but fitting **title**.
- The vignettes should be representative of the Alexie, Cisneros, Solis style. Therefore, the vignettes you create should include **figurative language**, **imagery**, **diction (word choice)**, and other elements of fiction such as **dialogue and blocking**—don't forget **Active Voice and Vigorous Verbs! REVIEW notebook pages 39 43**.
- Also, notice the variation of the **length** of his vignettes; however, do not assume that three sentences will get you by. He creates meaning in each vignette.
- A **visual** will be required for this writing assignment. Think of a cover page that symbolically represents some aspect of one or all three of your vignettes.

You will be scored on the following:

Format/Title – product is double spaced all the way through in Times New Roman, size 12 font, and your title for each vignette is creative and appropriate – **5 points**

Topic – addresses one, two, or three of the following topics: name, neighborhood, family, friend, school experience, and/or event

Figurative Language – metaphors and similes to strengthen meaning **Imagery** – SHOW don't tell

Diction – appropriate word choice matters and makes writing more powerful **Dialogue/Blocking** – dialogue helps reader understand character and blocking helps set

the scene (Dialogue is optional, but allow your characters to speak here and there!) **Active Voice** – subject performs the action

Vigorous Verbs – specific and vivid actions make the writing pop - 25 points

Conventions – the goal is to have little to no conventional errors, including, but not limited to spelling, capitalization, and grammatical errors. Review Dialogue Cheat Sheet (37-38 in notebook) – **5 points.**

Visual – The cover is visually appealing and much care and effort was taken to make the cover visually engaging. The cover reflects the vignettes associated with it – **15 points**
